

POLICE CAR UK

CODE OF CONDUCT

Every organisation needs a set of guidelines and rules to protect its members and the organisation itself. Please read the below Code of Conduct and sign and date in the appropriate place, before returning your application form. Failure to do so may delay or even decline your application.

1. Only PC-UK officials, as listed in the magazine, are entitled to use the organizations logo and letter heading in communication with any person or agency outside the membership.
2. No other member shall purport verbally, in writing, or by any other means to represent PC-UK.
3. Members shall at all times conduct themselves in a manner that does not reflect adversely on PC-UK or its membership.
4. Members will not attempt to photograph police vehicles on police or private premises without first seeking proper prior permission to do so (an exception to this rule is where the general public is admitted on a specific occasion, as in the case of an Open Day).
5. Where police vehicles are in public places, permission to photograph them should be obtained where practicable, and members must not act in any way that might interfere with or otherwise prejudice the work of any of the Emergency Services.
6. Any member found to have contravened the Code of Conduct is liable to have his/her membership terminated without refund of membership fee.
7. Preserved Police vehicle owners will abide by the law at all times when their vehicles are being used on the roads. All items of Police emergency equipment will be fully covered, removed or rendered inoperable when on the road. If you require further guidance on this matter contact a PC-UK representative before you travel. You are liable to arrest and prosecution if you fail to abide by the law.
